First Families of Defiance County and Centennial Families

<u>Defiance County First</u> Families

If you can prove your ancestor resided in Defiance County before January 1846, your ancestor can be classified as a "Pioneer." If he or she lived here between January 1846 and December



1860, that ancestor can be classified as a "Settler." To prove your lineage back to your ancestor, you may use birth records, death records, marriage licenses, census records, Bible records, and other primary or supportive secondary records.

The application fee is \$15.00 which covers as many ancestors as you can prove and also covers your membership pin. You must be a member of the Defiance County Chapter OGS. This membership may be paid at the same time as your application fee is paid. The cutoff date is August 1st of the year in which you apply. Defiance County Centennial Families

To acknowledge families which have been in Defiance County for 100 years or more, our chapter has established a centennial recognition program. Due to the COVID-19 virus, the Defiance there were no chapter meetings since February, and only two board meetings since that time. The board met at the St. John UCC in Defiance on July 22 and then conducted business via emails in November.

Minutes of the DCGS Board of July 22, 2020

Present: at the July DCGS Board were President Joanne Allison, Treasurer Dan Hasch, Corresponding Secretary Dianne Kline, Recording Secretary Mary Williams, Trustees: Pat Wise, Rhonda Casler, Dawn Hasch (also Membership Chair).

(Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this was the first board meeting since February 19, 2020. Minutes of the February board meeting were reviewed. Treasurer Dan Hasch presented monthly financial reports beginning with March with the following balances noted: March \$4798.47, April \$4832.05, May \$4897.05, June \$4877.05 and thus far in July \$4821.05. He also noted that he had emailed in the sales tax information for the previous year.

Dawn Hasch noted that there currently are 59 members; Dianne Kline noted over 185,000 hits to the blog site.

Discussion was held for memorials for Gladys Donson and Lavina Boesling-both long time officers of the chapter. Dianne will check with Gladys' grand-daughter Susan Brown to see the amount of donation collected. Dianne will also check with the library to see how much it will cost to have the Sherwood Chronicle digitalized.

Dan Hasch moved that due to the increasing numbers of COVID-19 cases in the area, the chapter suspend its programming and other events for the rest of the 2020 year. Chapter meetings for 2021 will be revisited at the beginning of the year; board meetings will be held only as needed. Rhonda Casler seconded the motion which carried.

It was also decided to provide a free membership for the 2021 year for those now enrolled, since all of our programming and events are cancelled for the remainder of the year. Dan Hasch made the motion; Pat Wise seconded the motion which carried.

Discussion was also held on a possible move of our records to the former Defiance Stamping Company on Perry Street. Rhonda Casler has agreed to be a liaison with Trish Sandford-Speiser concerning advertising our publication on vintagedefiance.com.

Minutes of November 2020 On-line Meetings

On November 23, 2020 Chapter Treasurer Dan Hasch emailed a proposed budget for the Society for 2021 for approval of the Board.

On November 24, 2020 President Joanne Allison noted that in a normal year, nominations for 2021 officers would have taken place and the membership had voted. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the society not meeting for most of 2020, this was not possible. She proposed not holding election for officers and the board until at least 2021. There were no objections to this by any of the online board members.

President Allison also noted that the 2020 Ohio Genealogy Society Conference had been cancelled, and plans for the 2021 convention are being made on a virtual platform. The virtual conference's theme is "Bringin' It Home," and it will be held April 14-17. Joanne noted that a virtual conference will save hotel and travel expenses.

On November 25, 2020 Rhonda Casler moved that the Board suspend its normal practices for voting, and that all voting by email will be considered valid. On November 25, 2020 Dan Hasch seconded the motion.

Dianne Kline moved to accept the proposed 2021 budget. Dan Hasch seconded the motion. Dianne Kline and Mary Williams voted via email to accept both motions. President Allison later noted that all board members had agreed to the two motions presented.

2021 Ohio Genealogical Society Virtual Conference April 14 - 17, 2021



New Hours effective until around January 28, 2021:

To research in the Center, you must make an appointment. That's easily done, though. Simply email Genealogy@ACPL.info and request your day(s) and time(s). You will receive a confirmation email from us, and you will use that to enter the building on the day(s) you want to research. Simply bring that confirmation with you on your smart phone or printed out to gain access to the building and the Genealogy Center. You can reserve multiple days at a time covering the next two months.

- 3. Ready to help via email, phone, and social media.

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

- 5. Online programs twice each week. Your Genealogy Center remains committed to presenting two virtual programs each week (unless there is a holiday on one of our normally scheduled days). Every Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 p.m. EST and every Thursday evening at 6:30 p.m. EST you can enjoy a family history program on Zoom. The large majority of these programs are recorded so you can enjoy them again on YouTube.
- 6. Utilize our digitized books on FamilySearch & Internet Archive.

In addition to the five million records and images freely available under the "Free Databases" link on the GenealogyCenter.org website, tens of thousands of our books have been digitized by the Internet Archive and FamilySearch. These books are freely available to read online, search through the texts, and even download. I

As with the other townships in the *History of Defiance County 1883*, selected reminiscences of early settlers in Milford Township can be found *[p. 325]..*

Milford Township was organized in 1837. This area originally was a part of Williams County until 1845 when it became a part of Defiance County. According to the 1883 History the first settlers who were present at the first election were the following: William G. Pierce, George Chapman, Linus Clark, Ezra Crary, Thomas Slater, Thomas Green, Jacob Weldon, Harrison Conkey, Elias Crary, Spencer Hopkins, John Henry, and George Green. Officers elected were Linus Clark - Justice of the Peace; Ezra Crary, George Chapman, and Thomas Slater -Trustees; Linus Clark- Treasurer; Ezra Crary -Clerk: and G. W. Pierce - constable. The first child born in Milford Township that lived to adulthood was Luther Slater in November 1835, and the first marriage was Jeremiah A. Ball to Malinda Slater in August 1836.

Churches in Milford Township in 1883 were the Universalist in Logan built in 1868, Lutheran Church in Section 10, and a Methodist Church built in 1872 in the northeaster part of the township.


Commercially, Arrowsmith Mill was located northwest of Lost Creek. The mill served the area until 1846.

As with the other townships in the *History of Defiance County 1883*, selected reminiscences of early settlers in Mark Township can be found *[p. 317]..*

Due to marshy conditions, Mark Township was the last township to be established by county commissioners in 1850. The proposed name for the township was to be Kenton in honor of early settler and hunter Mark Kenton. However, there was an existing post office named Kenton and so the title of Mark was settled upon.

Organization of the township was completed in April 1851 with the following 17 voters: Samuel Smith (supervisor), H. G. Luce (trustee), Samuel Fisher, Thomas Pope, W. C. Hutchinson (assessor and treasurer), John L. Ginter, M. C. D. Campbell (constable), John Kiser (constable), Harrison Jenkins (trustee), Samuel Onstott (trustee), Peter Frederick (clerk), George Hobbs, John Shafer, Martin Smith, Jacob Fisher,

George Poster, and John Garible.

Early Teachers

No. 1- William A. Slough, No. 2 - Mary J. Powell, No. 3 - Oren L. Hulbert, No. 4 - Oscar Works, No. 5 - Jacob Bruner. Other early teachers were Israel Baum, William Mann and James Evans.

Mark Center

The original village was laid out in the exact center of the township. However, in May 1875 when the B & O Railway came through the township. Frederick Harmening laid out the northern portion of a new village to the north of the railway. The southern portion was laid out by Josiah Kyle and A. M. Anderson. The Van Wert Stave Company was the early commercial endeavor employing at one time 50 employees. In addition in 1883 there were two hoop pole shaving enterprises, a saw steam mill, a blacksmith and shoe shops, a hotel, two retail stores, a millinery store, a saloon, an express stop, and a two-store school. A Methodist Church was established in the village and a Brethren Church was located in Section 25.
